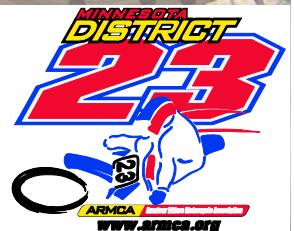

Mileage

- Family enduro will run on a 10 mile loop with fun trails for all ages and skill levels.
 - Micro and Macro will run 1 lap
 - All other classes and riders will run 2 laps

Other Information

- Family Enduro Information
 - The intent of the Family Enduro is to help teach the sport of enduros to the young riders and older riders who are new to off road riding. Enduro computers are not allowed, only an odometer and a watch will be needed for these events. The spirit of the Family Enduro is to have fun and treasure the time you ride with your entire family.
 - The course length is between 10 to 20 miles. We will be using the timekeeping format. One of our intentions is to teach the new enduro riders how to keep time at a traditional enduro. The speed averages for these events are 12 to 18 miles per hour depending on the terrain and length of the sections. There is a break (reset or pause) in between each loop to allow the participants a break and to allow for the sweep riders to clear the trail.
 - No lights / license are needed. The gas stop is 10 miles apart, so even the smallest bike (gas tank) can make a loop with no problems.
 - As a typical enduro, the checkpoints are secret. Each loop will have an emergency (tie breaker) check. Mileage markers will be posted through the loop as some of the riders may not have an odometer on their bike. In addition to the secret and emergency checks, we will use observation checks – part of the enduro experience.
 - Here is the class structure used in the Family Enduro.
 - Micro 4-8, oil injected 50cc 2 stroke or 4 stroke automatic (with max wheel diameter of 10 inches)
 - Macro 4-8, 50cc 2-stroke Premix chain, 80cc 4stroke. DS 80, PW 80, XR 80 (not all inclusive)
 - Peewee 7-11, 0-65cc 2-stroke; 9-11 PW 80, DS 80, 80cc 4-stroke; (not all inclusive)
 - Premier 7-15, 0-85cc 2-strokes, Big wheel 85/112, up to 150cc 4-stroke. Rider must be at least 12 years old to ride a motorcycle 86cc or larger 2-stroke and 150cc 4-stroke.(not all inclusive)
 - Girls 9-15,52-112cc two stroke/52-150cc four stroke. Rider must be at least 12 years old to ride a motorcycle 86cc or larger 2-stroke and 150cc 4-stroke.
 - Exhibition classes (X): Riders who want to be scored, but not interested in trophies.
 - If you just want to ride for fun to provide support to your child or family and not compete for a trophy, you will be assigned to the X class.
 - Micro and Macro classes will start on later rows to minimize traffic and passing on the trail.
 - In general, parents and support riders should ride BEHIND their child. It is easier to monitor their riding and helps the

rider develop a better understanding of timekeeping and strategy if they attempt to ride the event on their own as much as possible.
